Fuelled by a desire for economic independence, I embarked on establishing a garment unit with the backing of the Tamil Nadu State Rural Livelihood Mission. Initially comprising just 40 women under the Poverty Alleviation Scheme, our venture gained momentum with the arrival of the Tamil Nadu Rural Transformation Project in our block of Dindigul district. They conducted extensive discussions with our women's group, offering valuable insights on optimizing our operations and introducing innovation.

Recognizing our sourcing challenges from Karur for materials, the team tailored suggestions to enhance our products and expand our market reach. Guiding us through the application process, they facilitated access to grants, enabling the procurement of essential machinery and equipment. For instance, the team helped us to fill the forms to obtain grants and helped us to submit the same to the government. Once they released the funds after we submitted the right documents that were scrutinised by authorities concerned, we were able to purchase sewing machines,

cutting machines, tables and other necessary furniture for the business.

Today, our business thrives with seamless operations and a growing clientele, predominantly in Karur. Timely deliveries and product innovation have fueled our exponential growth, leading to increased employment opportunities within our garment unit. Grateful for the transformative impact of government initiatives, we are indebted to the TN government for revolutionizing our livelihoods.

Farmer Producer Groups (FPGs) play a crucial role in fostering cooperation and camaraderie among farmers, enabling them to engage in various agricultural activities and leverage government schemes effectively. Serving as a vital link in the farm-to-table chain, FPGs empower farmers to navigate market dynamics and negotiate with stakeholders.

In 2019, our community in Gujiliyamparai recognized the potential of forming an FPG to enhance market intelligence and strengthen our bargaining power. With over

30 members joining our group on 20/07/19, we secured a loan of Rs. 1,00,000, which was allocated among the members and meticulously repaid.

The intervention of TNRTP further enriched our agricultural practices, with insightful meetings focusing on optimizing farming methods, household incomes, and exploring ancillary businesses. Inspired by these discussions, we identified the cattle feed industry as a lucrative opportunity to boost milk production in our villages.

The subsequent expansion of our FPG

attracted more members, swelling our ranks to 60. With the initial grant of Rs. 75,000 from TNRTP, we delved into the intricacies of cattle feed production and strategically priced our products to penetrate local markets. The venture yielded promising returns, motivating us to diversify into farming and milk production-related merchandise.

Grateful for TNRTP's transformative impact on our lives, we remain optimistic about the future and look forward to continued growth and prosperity.



PASSION WITH PICKLES LIFTED MY LIFE'S TRIFLES

I am Anandhi, a determined entrepreneur who has made significant strides in the pickle business. Driven by a strong desire to enhance my personal growth, assert my individuality, and bolster my financial stability, I joined the Malligai Women Self-Help Group (SHG) six years ago, which proved to be financially rewarding.

During a post-pandemic SHG meeting, we learned about the funding opportunities offered by the Tamil Nadu Rural Transformation Project (TNRTP). Eager to seize the opportunity, many members, including myself, applied for the funds.

I was elated when I received a sanction of Rs. 25,000 to kickstart my own venture (Mummy Pickles).

My life took on a flavourful twist and with newfound financial independence, I ventured into the pickle business. While the initial growth was slow, I was determined to expand. However, financial constraints hindered my progress. Just when I was on the verge of giving up, I learned about the support provided by TNRTP, offering a 30% subsidy and 10% marginal amount to supported entrepreneurs. With the assistance of authorities and the Mathi

Siragugal Thozhil Maiyum (MSTM) Service Centre, I applied for the scheme, and my hopes were not in vain. I secured a loan of Rs. 4,36,356 from the bank.

This timely financial boost propelled my business to new heights. Today, my pickles are sought after by customers from neighbouring villages, and I generate a daily income of Rs. 3,000-3,500. My success is a testament to my perseverance and the unwavering support of the Government. I am confident that resilient women like myself will continue to leverage such government schemes to carve out successful paths for themselves in the future.

In the district of Kallakurichi lies our village, Rangappanur, home to just over 2,000 residents. Our community thrives on agriculture, with many of us relying on daily wage labour. Among us, some are skilled in pottery and other clay-related crafts. However, lacking business expertise and proper guidance, our potters struggle to make ends meet.

When the TNRTP reached out to our village, we were elated by the opportunity it presented. They enlightened us about various government schemes and how we could benefit from them. Inspired by the

information, 16 potters united to form a group and joined forces with TNRTP. Each member received assistance in opening a bank account, and TNRTP provided an initial fund of Rs. 75,000. Additionally, they facilitated the acquisition of a crucial mud kneading machine through a tender process.

This machine, priced at Rs. 75,000, significantly reduced our workload, allowing us to increase pottery production and seize more business opportunities. TNRTP also aided us in selling our products at profitable rates, leading to growth in our savings.

Furthermore, a government Green Audit team visited our workspace, offering valuable advice on environmental preservation. We diligently followed their guidance, which proved enlightening for all of us.

We extend our gratitude to TNRTP and the Tamil Nadu government for paving the way for a better livelihood and imparting knowledge on environmental stewardship. We pledge to adhere to their guidelines and continue our journey towards sustainable prosperity

I am S. Gomathi, member of a women's self-help group for almost five years. While each of us in the group pursued individual businesses, it was the intervention of TNRTP in our village that sparked the idea of collaborative entrepreneurship. Following comprehensive training sessions attended by 35 SHGs on pickle, masala powder, and appalam making, 14 women were selected to form a cohesive team.

We pooled together Rs. 8,400 and established a bank account to formalize our venture. Addressing various business-related challenges, we presented our proposal to TNRTP, ultimately securing a grant of Rs. 75,000. This marked the beginning of our journey, as we delved into pickle and other product manufacturing, maintaining high standards.

Today, we generate an income of nearly Rs. 10,000 monthly. This initiative has empowered us to stride confidently in our endeavours, no longer reliant on external factors. We express our heartfelt gratitude to TNRTP for their guidance and unwavering support in our entrepreneurial pursuits.





WHITE AS THE MILK BUSINESS IS SMOOTH AS SILK

As a longstanding member of the Mullai Women Self Help Group for nearly seven years, I, A. Kalaimani, was intrigued when I learnt about the opportunities provided by the TNRTP. Together, some of us from the village gathered and established a Farmer Producer Group in our village to harness the benefits offered by the project. Word quickly spread, and an impressive 70 women from Peraiyur joined our ranks, each contributing

a membership fee of Rs. 100. With assistance from the TNRTP, we set up a bank account for the group and submitted our proposals for consideration.

Upon review, the TNRTP allocated a generous sum of Rs. 75,000 to our group,

generous sum of Rs. 75,000 to our group, enabling us to procure essential equipment and vessels to launch a milk business. With surplus funds, we ventured into establishing a cattle feed outlet as well. Presently, our

group successfully sells 900 litres of milk to Aavin daily, resulting in a substantial income ranging from Rs. 15,000 to Rs. 20,000.

Looking ahead, we aspire to expand into selling various milk products. We express our heartfelt gratitude to the TNRTP for empowering us to secure a sustainable livelihood and for significantly improving our quality of life.

MINISTER PROVIDES MATCHING GRANT FUND



On February 8th, Honourable Minister of Youth Welfare and Sports Development, Shri. Udhayanidhi Stalin, provided empowerment to 15 TNRTP beneficiaries. A Matching Grant Programme (MGP) Fund totalling 64,34,730 was allocated for this purpose. The Matching Grant Programme (MGP) is a financial assistance initiative designed to support entrepreneurship and economic development initiatives, particularly targeted towards marginalized and underprivileged communities. Under this program, beneficiaries receive grants that are matched with their own contributions or investments, thereby leveraging resources and maximizing impact.

She engaged in discussions with them regarding marketing linkages, optimal product selection, product varieties, customer preferences, and frequency of purchases.

Diverse Technical Training Initiatives Empower Women





The technical assistance extended by the Tamil Nadu Rural Transformation Project (TNRTP) to rural women-led enterprises has served as a vital pillar, fortifying and empowering them. Established with the aim of fostering robust resources within rural businesses across Tamil Nadu, TNRTP has effectively rendered comprehensive support across 120 blocks spanning 31 districts, encompassing 3994 village Panchayats. The project is geared towards elevating women's skills to professional standards and enabling them to carve a niche in the business realm. To this end, the project has initiated four distinct Industrial Development Training programs tailored for rural women, equipping them with the necessary tools to thrive in the entrepreneurial landscape.

Apprentice and vocational training for individuals and working groups

In rural areas, women and Women Self Help Groups (SHGs) are being empowered through diverse technical training initiatives. These programs encompass skills such as crafting handicraft items from palm leaves, shells, banana fibre, clay, and Lantana, as well as mastering Kurumba paintings and creating bio seed rolls. Moreover, training is provided in repairing air conditioners and two-wheelers, catering to diverse vocational interests. Tailoring, particularly aari embroidery, remains a popular choice among rural women, alongside weaving artificial silk and kora silk. Additionally, women express enthusiasm in learning to craft Tanjore dolls and various clay dolls. The Tamil Nadu Rural Transformation Project (TNRTP) actively supports these endeavours, providing tailored technical training to aspiring learners, thereby fostering empowerment within rural communities.

Enhancing agricultural efficiency Farm training for producer groups

The TNRTP program aims to enhance the agricultural efficiency of farmers in rural areas by providing them with essential farm training. Through this initiative, women farmers receive funds and guidance to improve the quality and yield of their harvests. They are trained in various techniques such as producing natural fertilizers like Panchagavam, Vermi compost, fish amino acid, and honey solution. This ongoing training has enabled them to adopt natural farming practices at a lower cost, leading to improvements in soil quality and better management of water resources on their lands. As a result, they have not only created a healthier environment for human and biological diversity but have also evolved into successful producer groups.

Formation of Operational Teams

The TNRTP facilitates the formation of working groups among rural women engaging in diverse vocational endeavours. These initiatives aid in establishing operational teams and securing financial support for their enterprises, including assistance in UDAYAM Registration, FSSAI License, PAN Card acquisition, and effective management of banking accounts. Additionally, the TNRTP supports the upskilling of women's groups, offering market linkages and business development training to enable direct selling of their produce.

Advancement of Farmer Producer Organizations

Under the TNRTP scheme, Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) established as shareholders within Farmer Producer Groups (FPG) and individual farmers across Tamil Nadu's blocks have received extensive support. This assistance includes value addition for food products essential for the federation through vocational training. Moreover, initiatives encompass the establishment of business identities for direct product marketing, packaging, licensing, environmental sustainability, machinery support, procurement of transport vehicles, and enhancement of resource management skills.

Support Offered by "Mathi Siragugal Thozhil Maiyam"

Under the TNRTP initiative, entrepreneurs across 120 blocks in Tamil Nadu have been provided with startup and fixed industrial support through the "Mathi Siragugal Thozhil Maiyam," a centre of excellence. The Tamil Nadu government has facilitated the initiation of activities in this centre by promoting various industrial projects and facilitating the collection of necessary documentation. This includes documents required under industrial plans, project proposals for financial assistance, mentorship for financial and technical support, establishment of business market linkages, securing legal clearances and industrial licenses, Udayam registration, and other services. These services are available online as well as through a direct process, ensuring comprehensive support for entrepreneurs across the state.

In this manner, the TNRTP provides guidance to all Tamil Nadu entrepreneurs, steering them toward the path of success.
